What is Multicultural Inclusion?

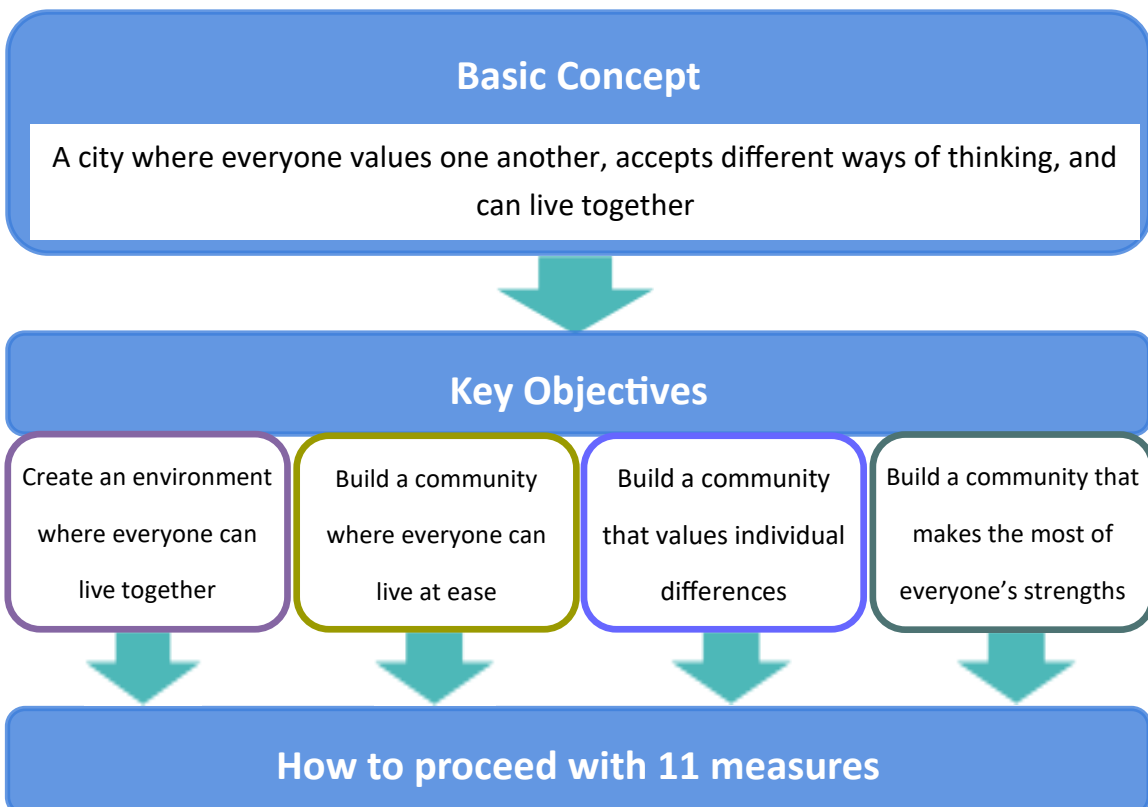
It's when people of different nationalities and ethnicities accept their cultural differences and live together as fellow residents of Narita City without discrimination and on equal footing.

We need all residents to help make our city a comfortable place to live.

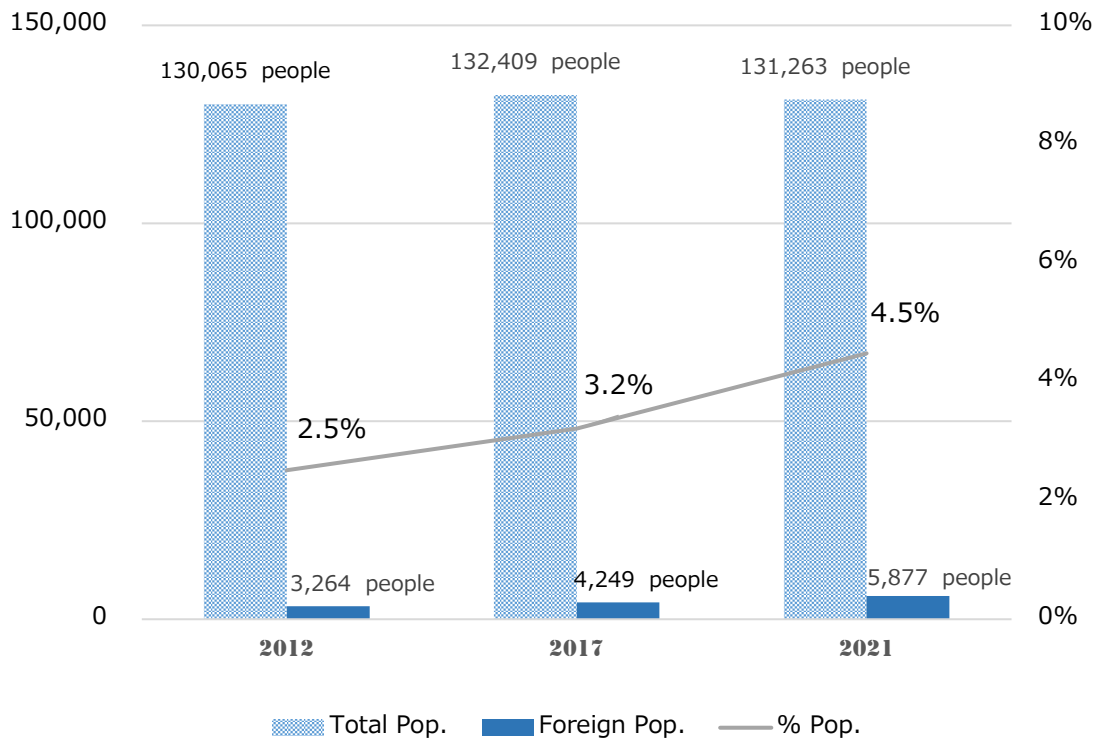
In order to create a society where people understand each other's cultures and accept different ways of thinking, we have put together our concept for multicultural inclusion in Narita City.



State of Foreign Residents in Narita City

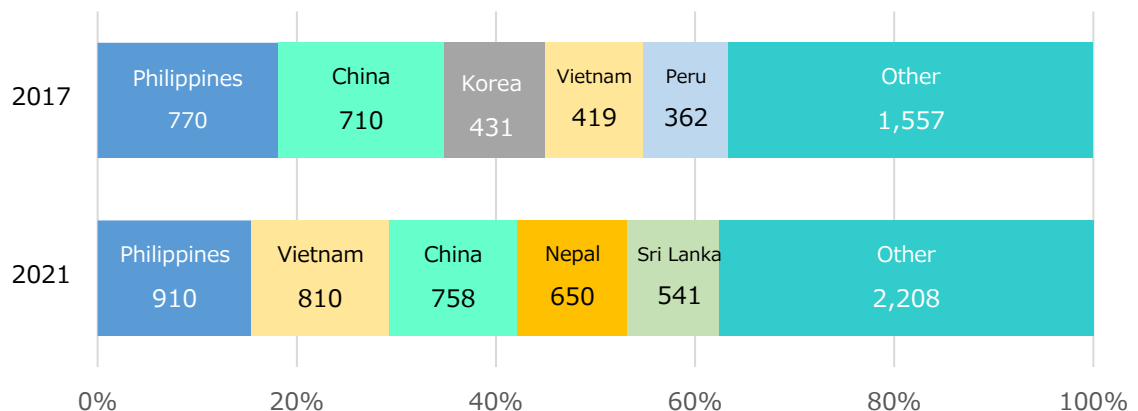
Population Changes

The number of foreign residents registered in Narita City has increased by 1,628 (38.3%) over the past four years as compared to the end of March 2017.



Population by Country/Region

As the number of foreign residents has increased, so has the number of countries and regions they come from, growing from 63 countries and regions at the end of March 2017 to 66 countries and regions by the end of March 2021.

| Create an environment where everyone can live together | (1) Publish city announcements and useful information in foreign languages. Establish consultation centers. | Run the General Information Desk for Foreigners. Publish pamphlets in different languages. |
| | (2) Make it easier for foreign residents to learn Japanese. | Hold Japanese language classes for foreign residents. |
| | (3) Help foreign residents learn more about Japanese culture. | Deliver information that is useful to foreign residents. Conduct on-site lectures. |
| Build a community where everyone can live at ease | (4) Create an environment conducive to studying and learning. | Send Japanese language teachers to the homes of foreign students. Conduct classes to know about different countries around the world. |
| | (5) Create an environment where people can work with a sense of security. | Teach skills needed at work. Support people who want to start their own business. |
| | (6) Create systems to help people in the event of a disaster. | Establish plans in preparation for earthquakes, typhoons, and other natural disasters. Send out notifications from the city in multiple languages. |
| | (7) Provide childcare, health and welfare, and medical services. | Hand out Maternal and Child Health Handbooks. Offer consultations on concerns and worries related to childcare. |
| Build a community that values individual differences | (8) Provide help finding housing. | Utilize the Housing Safety Net System. |
| | (9) Promote understanding of multicultural inclusion and foster an inclusive environment. | Hold the International Citizen Festival. Promote understanding of the importance of human rights. |
| Build a community that makes the most of everyone's strengths | (10) Help foreign residents participate in community and societal events more easily. | Promote international exchange and mutual understanding that transcends borders. |
| | (11) Improve upon the positive aspects of Narita City together with the help of foreign residents and adapt to globalization. | Develop the "Narita" brand. Promote the concept of universal tourism. |
